From Father Thompson,

Many of our older parishioners may recall that in their youth, the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was exclusively thought of in terms of “Last Rites.” Even an older name for this sacrament, Extreme Unction, came from the term *in extremis*, referring to the very end of life. While those who are preparing for death absolutely should avail themselves of the sacraments of the Church, Anointing should not be considered only a ceremony for the dying. The requirement to receive the Anointing of the Sick is simply that one be affected by a pathology (of mind or body) that is causing one to be confronted with one's own frailty and ultimate mortality. The pathology needs to be serious, so a cold or a flesh wound would not qualify, but on the other hand the pathology need not be one that puts you in mortal danger per se. Serious illnesses, serious injuries, complications from medical conditions, and so forth all qualify, as does the simple situation of being elderly (as there may not be one particular thing that is calling attention to your own frailty and mortality, but a constellation of aches, pains, and limitations). This is all to say, if you find yourself in need of this sacrament, never hesitate to ask for it. Also, do not fear to ask for it or accept your family's offer to call the priest, thinking that it is a sign that you are actively dying or that you can only receive it once. The sacraments are here to heal and fortify you through the experiences of life, and God wants to be sacramentally present to you in those moments of suffering.

There is a set of sacraments and prayers, which we could call Last Rites, that are proper for someone who is likely to die soon, which consists of Confession, with an opportunity for a plenary indulgence, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Communion given as *Viaticum*—which means “bread for the journey,” and a prayer of commendation of the dying person to the prayers of the Saints and to God's mercy. This should be requested when the dying person is still conscious and able to participate fully, especially to make a Confession and to be able to eat so that he can receive Holy Communion, but much of it can be done for a person who has lost consciousness, changing what needs to be changed. Please do not wait until the last moments, I would encourage that Last Rites be given as soon as Hospice is begun, and then periodically as needed, since it can be repeated. At the very least, it will ease the mind and heart of your loved one nearing the end of life. Feel free to request Anointing (or Confession, for that matter) at any time; I literally carry a stole and holy oils in my pocket at all times.
